## TANZHOCHDREI DIGITAL Luísa Saraiva & Senem Gökçe Oğultekin HARK!

In *Hark*! Luísa Saraiva and Senem Gökçe Oğultekin explore their love and interest in baroque music. With singing bodies, they build a relationship with the audience, turning sound into an experience and allowing for immersion into the music. The singing leaves traces in space, traces of sonorous bodies. Together with musicians Peter Rubel and Nathan Bontrager they are proposing a common understanding of movement and sound. *Hark*! - Listen! Henry Purcell's *Hail! Bright Cecilia* and Nicholas Brady's libretto support the quest for an acoustic body that hears, receives, reverberates and echoes.

At the core of the work was the wish to create an immersive sound experience, with a focus on the movement of sound passing through and around the audience. By searching for a listening and acoustic quality in dancing, we hoped to create a context that privileges the effects of resonance and vibration in the experience of watching dance, and on how one can be moved and touched by sound.

This documentation is a one-hour collection of excerpts in a non-linear fashion recorded during the final rehearsals in December 2020. Since the piece was planned as a four-hour format the choice of the length and materials of this video can be seen as a proposal on our part, as a possible viewpoint of *Hark!*.

## BIOGRAPHIES

Luísa Saraiva is a choreographer and performer born in Porto, Portugal. She studied Psychology at the University of Porto and Dance at Folkwang University. In 2010, she received the INOV-Art scholarship from the Portuguese Ministry of Culture, and in 2017 the one-year scholarship for artistic development by the Nordrhein-Westfalen Ministry of Culture. Her piece *A Concert* in collaboration with Lea Letzel was awarded the NRW Ground Support Prize in 2018. As a curator she has worked together with Museum Folkwang in Essen and Galeria Municipal do Porto in interdisciplinary Symposium and exhibition formats. In 2019, she received the danceWEB scholarship under the mentorship of Mette Ingvartsen, Anne Juren and Annie Dorsen, and in the season of 2019/2020 she was one of the choreographers-in-residence at K3 | Tanzplan Hamburg. https://luisasaraiva.com/

Senem Gökce Ogultekin was born in 1982 in Izmir, Turkey. In 2001 she came to Essen to study stage dance at the Folkwang University of the Arts, which she completed with the Folkwang Dance Prize of the Josef and Else Classen - Foundation. As a freelance performer she has worked with VA Wölfl/ NEUER TANZ, Meg Stuart, Laurent Chétouane and Mara Tsironi, among others. Her choreographic film *Dun/Home* was selected by Istanbul Modern Museum for Artist's Film International 2019 by Whitechapel Gallery London and has been shown in prestigious galleries and museums around the world. In 2020, Senem Gökçe Ogultekin was awarded the Allbau Foundation Culture Prize and was appointed to the Young College by the North Rhine-Westphalian Academy of Sciences and Arts in 2021. <u>http://senemgokce.com/</u>

Nathan Bontrager (1984), born in the U.S.A., is a cellist and multi-instrumentalist. He feels at home in a wide variety of different music styles. The spectrum ranges from the Renaissance, over traditional music from the Appalachian Mountains to avant-garde jazz. He has worked with Anthony Braxton, Marc Ribot, Mary Halverson, Gerry Hemingway, Joe Morris, Jherek Bischoff and director Robert Wilson. **Peter Rubel**, born 1992 in Kirchheim-Bolanden, lives and works in Essen. He studied instrumental and electronic composition at the Folkwang University of the Arts in Essen with Günter Steinke, Dirk Reith and Roman Pfeifer, as well as organ with Roland Stangier. During this time, he created compositions for various ensembles, tape music, and pieces for dance and theater productions. In addition to his work as a composer, Peter is a member of various ensembles / bands such as Tired, GLIS GLIS, International Music, Laava, The Dusseldorf Düsterboys. Since 2016, board member of GNMR - Gesellschaft Neue Musik Ruhr - and the event group Stromspiesser.
